Dear Mr. McDougall,

The Copyright Board Notice of April 18th required that the Collectives report to the Board regarding the status of their negotiations to settle the allocation of royalties no later than July 15th.

Accordingly, on behalf of all Collectives, FWS reports as follows:

FWS' April 15th report to the Board outlined generally the nature of the viewing data and the process for resolving title disputes. FWS had hoped to circulate lists of title conflicts to all Collectives by the end of May. We did so in fact on June 10th.

Of the over 30,000 titles in the viewing study, over 20,000 are not in dispute. The parties are now engaged in resolving the titles that are in dispute, and FWS has received some title resolutions already.

The process of resolving conflicts between collectives often requires a review of the relevant production and broadcast agreements of the members involved. Summer schedules will slow the process somewhat. Accordingly, FWS proposes to report back on behalf of all Collectives by September 10th.
