Dear Mr. McDougall,

The Notice of the Board dated July 15, 2016 required that the Collectives report to the Board regarding the status of their negotiations to settle the allocation of royalties by no later than September 9, 2016.

Accordingly, on behalf of all Collectives, FWS reports as follows:

FWS' previous report on July 15th noted that out of the 30,000+ titles in the viewing study, approximately 10,000 titles were in dispute, and that the collectives had begun the process of resolving those title disputes. The process of resolving conflicts between collectives often requires a review of the relevant production and broadcast agreements of the members involved. It was expected that summer schedules might slow this process to some extent.

Since July 15th, FWS has received title resolutions affecting most collectives, and resolving about 40% of the title disputes that were outstanding. As a result, over 70% of title claims in the viewing study are now uncontested. Updated conflict tables were prepared and distributed to the collectives in late August that reflect these resolutions.

FWS hopes to receive the second round of title conflict resolutions by the end of September, and to distribute updated conflict data to the collectives by mid-October. The updated conflict tables will provide a basis for further discussions among the collectives. The collectives of course reserve all of their rights in connection with the allocation, including the right to object to the viewing study as the basis for the allocation.

Accordingly, FWS proposes to report back to the Board on behalf of all Collectives by November 10, 2016.
