UNLOCATABLE COPYRIGHT OWNERS

Non-exclusive licence issued to Professor Daniel Coleman, McMaster University, for the reproduction of a poster created by Francis Robert Halliday

Pursuant to the provisions of subsection 77(1) of the *Copyright Act*, the Copyright Board grants a licence to Professor Daniel Coleman, McMaster University, as follows:

(1) The licence authorizes the reproduction, in the book entitled *White Civility: The Literary Project of English Canada* prepared by Professor Coleman, of the poster entitled "National Progress" created by Francis Robert Halliday (1884-1976) for the 1921 Canadian National Exhibition in Toronto.

No more than 1,000 copies of the work shall be reproduced.

This licence does not release the licensee from the obligation to obtain permission for any other use not covered by this licence.

(2) The licence expires on December 31, 2006. The authorized reproduction must therefore be completed by that date.

(3) The licence is non-exclusive and valid only in Canada. For other countries, it is the law of that country that applies.

(4) The licensee will pay \$84 to the Canadian Artists' Representation Copyright Collective (CARCC) who may dispose of the amount as it sees fit for the general benefit of its members. CARCC undertakes, however, to reimburse the amount to any person who establishes, before December 31, 2011, ownership of the copyright of the work covered by this licence.

(5) The coming into force of this licence is conditional on the filing with the Board of a receipt from CARCC for the amount of the royalty specified in the licence, accompanied by CARCC's undertaking to comply with the conditions set out in paragraph (4) above.
